Our cross-country season came to a thrilling end last week with both the mid-Cornwall finals and the Cornwall finals taking place.

On Monday, eight runners from across Key Stage 2 took part in some very fast races at Helston Community College. All eight ran brilliantly, with three qualifying for the County Finals on Thursday at Newquay Sports Centre.

The standard of running was incredibly high on the windy fields at Newquay, but Maisie, Lily and Conor all ran superbly. Maisie won a bronze medal for finishing 3rd in the Year 4 girls race, whilst Lily came 34th our of 82 in the same race. Conor competed in the Year 6 boys race and can be very proud of finishing 22nd out of 84.

There was a real hands-on feel about the school in the last week of term and there was lots of fun being had with designing and making all the way through the school.

In Foundation Stage, Classes 1 and 2 were busy making chocolate nests and truffles, whilst also creating paper baskets to carry their treats.


